

The Abu Dhabi Festival hosts its shows in the various arts venues in the city such as the Arts Center at New York University Abu Dhabi, the Auditorium at Emirates Palace Hotel, the Abu Dhabi Cultural Foundation among many others. Abu Dhabi Festival brings the world's greatest singers and musicians to Abu Dhabi, many of them performing in the Middle East for the first time.



Through its Festival in the Park, ADF is also multifaceted cultural celebration for people of all ages, abilities and cultural backgrounds to come together in celebration of creativity through performances, workshops, film screenings and much more.

Historical analysis estimates the Abu Dhabi Festival has been a key catalyst for over USD163 million of spend from 2008 to 2018

Attended by 86 different nationalities every year
